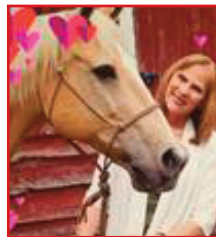
May 13th - Kip Robinson



Kip Robinson is a retired nuclear engineer and United Methodist missionary, having served with his wife Reverend Nancy Robinson in Sierra Leone, West Africa. His role as a missionary was two-fold...serving as the

mission team coordinator for the Sierra Leone Annual Conference and also serving as the Conference Engineer. While there, he helped design and build a primary school as a model for all future Sierra Leone UMC primary schools. He was instrumental in the revitalization of the UMC hospital at Rotifunk, where substantial upgrades were required to place it back in service after years of neglect caused by civil war. The Ebola crisis occurred during their tenure in Sierra Leone. Duck Church supports the hospital in Rotifunk.

May 20th - Rev. Dr. Laura Early



Rev. Dr. Laura G. Early is an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church. She is the Executive Director of The Place of Possibilities, Inc., and has served as the founding and Lead Pastor of All God's Children UMC in Aulander, NC

for over 17 years. In 1997, God called her to Aulander, NC to pastor a community in profound poverty. Using a church building that had been abandoned for years, she launched "All God's Children United Methodist Church," which was birthed in response to the Bishop's Initiative on Children and the Impoverished.

Dean Heath's scholarly work integrates systematic, pastoral, and spiritual theology in ways that bridge the gap between academy, church, and world. Her research interests focus on evangelism and spirituality. Heath is the author of numerous books and monographs, the most recent of which is Five Means of Grace: Experience God's Love the Wesleyan Way (2017). Her other publications include God Unbound: Wisdom from Galatians for the Anxious Church (2016), Missional.Monastic.Mainline (co-authored with Larry Duggins, 2014), The Mystic Way of Evangelism, Revised and Updated 2nd Edition (2017), Naked Faith: The Mystical Theology of Phoebe Palmer (2009), Longing for Spring: A New Vision for Wesleyan Communities (co-authored with Scott Kisker, 2010), We Were the Least of These: Reading the Bible with Survivors of Sexual Abuse (2011).
