WORKSHOP:

Artist and designer Zizi Barhouma will share her Columbian and Egyptian heritage, and the influence culture has on her art. Students will learn about ancient Egyptians as they create a self-portrait using the traditional headpieces worn in ancient times.

In this workshop students will:

- Create a self-portrait with their own head piece in the style of the Pharaohs
- Use their imagination to express their inner king or queen
- Be encouraged to embrace their individuality by choosing their own patterns, geometric shapes, and color combinations

Materials provided for recorded presentation: 11x14 toned tan paper, class pack of oil pastels

Additional materials needed: preprinted b&w photocopy of profile of student's face (student may also draw their profile,) scissors, glue stick (no glue stick needed if drawing profile,) black marker, pencil, and eraser

CURRICULUM CONNECTION

Social Studies, Social and Emotional Learning

WARM UP IDEAS:

- Provide a timeline of ancient Egyptian civilization.
- Explain the significance of the vegetation along the Nile River and the harvesting of the Papyrus plant.
- Show images of various Ancient Egyptian rulers including their Queens and their wardrobes. Pay special attention to patterns and colors.
