ICE SKATING INSTITUTE (ISI) AFFILIATION

Talbot Figure Skating Club members are enrolled by the Team as members of the Ice Skating Institute (ISI). The Ice Skating Institute is an international trade association encompassing all aspects of the ice skating industry. ISI was founded in 1959 as an organization for owners, operators and developers of ice skating facilities. The mission and goals of ISI are to promote ice skating as a participant sport and recreation and to provide information for the development, construction and operation of ice skating facilities. The Ice Skating Institute is dedicated to providing leadership, education and services to the ice skating industry.

Your ISI membership provides program materials and a quarterly magazine mailed to your home. The ISI testing standards are used by our coaches and instructors. ISI rules and standards also apply at all skating competitions sanctioned by ISI. Skaters will use their ISI membership numbers when registering for most figure skating competitions. MEMBER BENEFITS/FEES

All skaters who plan to participate on a TFSC synchronized skating or production team, as well as any skater who plans to participate in TFSC exhibitions as a soloist or as part of a couple or ensemble, or who compete on behalf of TFSC, need to be active members of the Talbot Figure Skating Club and pay the annual membership fee for the season. TFSC Annual Membership runs from September 1 through August 31 each year. (ISI Membership year runs from September 1 through August 31 each year as well.)

Skaters must pay membership fees on time. All invoices must be paid upon receipt to keep things moving smoothly throughout the season. If invoices are not paid in a timely manner, late fees may be incurred and in some extreme cases skaters may not be able to participate in certain events

All membership fees are non-refundable. Membership fees cover only a portion of the cost of running the Talbot Figure Skating Club. Fundraising efforts and profits from various annual activities are critical for covering the remainder of the Team costs and help keep individual member costs as low as possible.

Fundraising opportunities may also be made available to assist in reducing your membership and/or group fees (i.e. Synchronized/Production skating teams, Ensemble groups, Jump & Spin teams, Exhibitions, and Home Ice Competitions). Fundraising credits apply only to the current skating year and do not carry over beyond August 30th of the current season. Note that a skater's fundraising credits will carry over to the next season if the TCCC rink closes prematurely due to Covid.

SKATING OPPORTUNITIES

TFSC provides a variety of ways that skaters can develop their skills and enhance their experience on the ice at Talbot Community Center, but we encourage skaters to take advantage of all the opportunities that meet their needs, including enrolling in Talbot Parks & Recreation offerings and/or working with a private coach, as discussed in more detail below.

GROUP LESSONS

The Talbot Community Center allocates and schedules ice time for all skaters. Group lessons are available for skaters from beginning through freestyle levels through the county's Learn to Skate program. Skaters are grouped for group lessons based on ability determined by their ISI test level. The Talbot Community Center dictates the cost of the group lessons. PRIVATE LESSONS

Skaters have an option to contract an instructor for private lessons. Skating professionals will provide these lessons. It is up to the team member/family to contact the professional instructors to see the availability of these options. The cost for private lessons is determined by the professional instructor, and skaters are generally required to pay for both ice time and the coach's fee for private lessons... Ice time is determined and remains the responsibility of the professional instructor's schedule and agreement. TFSC private coaches may choose to use TFSC Club Ice as well as TCCC freestyle ice. All arrangements for private lessons are strictly between the parents and the instructor. TCCC FREESTYLE SESSIONS

The Talbot County Community Center posts their Freestyle schedule throughout the year and is available to all skaters. This is a great opportunity for skaters to practice their skills and routines. TFSC CLUB ICE

Various times in the season the club has purchased club ice for parties, freestyle sessions, synchronized skating practices and miscellaneous activities. Please refer to the updated calendar of events for the season on TFSC's website. TFSC members can skate at Club Ice Freestyle sessions at a discounted rate. Club members can also purchase non-transferable Club Ice punch cards that provide TFSC members with a more discounted rate for each Club Ice session.

SKATING COMPETITIONS

Figure skating competitions are where many teams/clubs meet to compete for awards in all ages and skating levels. TFSC plans to run one competition at the Talbot Community Center each season, as do several other teams in Maryland, Delaware, and Virginia. Registration, payment of fees, coaching and travel arrangements for any competition are the responsibility of the member who chooses to participate. (All TFSC Synchro and Production teams will have their registrations completed for them by team coaches or board members.) Further information concerning or arrangements for the entry into a competition will be shared via email with all of our members and can also be obtained from a skater's private coach.

SKATING EXHIBITIONS

Talbot Figure Skating Club plans to host two Exhibitions during each season. The schedule for these exhibitions will be announced to TFSC members as soon as they are approved by TCCC.

TFSC's synchro and production teams, as well as TCCC's Showtime group, are expected to be available to perform in these exhibitions, and the costs for their participation are included in team-specific fees.

TFSC skaters are also invited to perform in team exhibitions as a soloist, duet/couples, or in organized ensembles. Skaters will be asked to register for solo/duet/small group performances approximately six weeks prior to these shows and will be charged a performance fee per show. Because we have a limited amount of ice time for each exhibition, performances will be accepted on a first-come/first-served basis.

SKATING EQUIPMENT AND SAFETY

Skaters should come to the rink dressed in warm layers of clothing. Some wear skating dresses with warm tights or leggings and sweaters, however it is not required. Gloves are recommended and are very important for young skaters' safety, comfort and warmth.

All TFSC members and family members will be required to adhere to any and all safety regulations established by TCCC during the course of the season. Refusal to follow TCCC regulations can lead to a member being suspended from TFSC.

Skaters should have a well-fitted pair of leather skates that have good support for the skaters' ankles. Skates typically fit the foot like a glove and are usually a size smaller than the skaters' shoe size. For a list of pro-shops and/or recommended skate brands, please see your coach or anyone on the TFSC board.

Skate guards should be worn when going to and from the ice surface to protect the blades from getting damaged and dull. Skates should be sharpened depending on the number of hours the skates are being used per week, please consult a skating professional (coach or pro-shop) for advice. (Talbot Community Center does offer skate sharpening.) Skate blades should always be dried off with a dry towel after use and stored in a bag with soakers (cloth blade covers) to absorb moisture and to protect the blades from hitting together.

It is strongly recommended that parents remain at the rink during lesson and freestyle/team times. If you need to leave the rink, please let another parent know in the event of an emergency.

BULLYING POLICY

Bullying of any type will not be tolerated. If a skater is caught bullying another member or making fun of a teammate, the parent of the skater or the skater will be notified immediately that they must stop the behavior. If the skater is caught bullying a second time, that skater will be asked to leave the club. TFSC promotes teamwork and friendships among skaters. Bullying of any type will not be condoned.

- 2. Parents will be responsible to keep their skaters informed about schedules, ice rules, practices, and handbook information.
